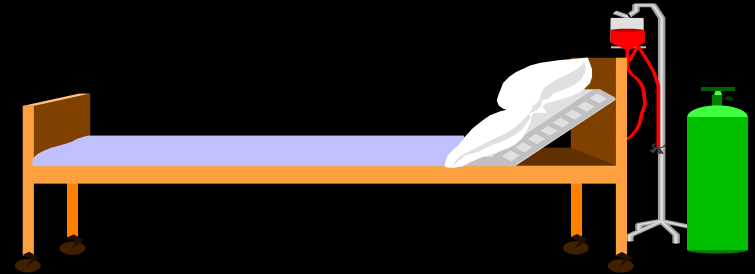

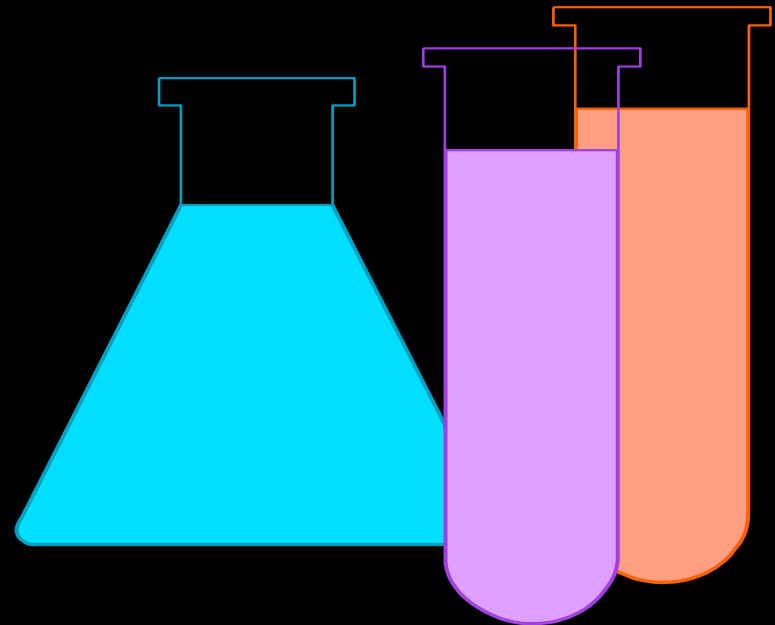


2 - High Density Occupancies A2 ...
